Post Secondary Information for Students

Students: January will be a very busy month preparing for your final exams and diploma exams. Be careful that the time doesn't creep up on you and do not wait until the last minute to start preparing.

During exam week, it is also a good time for you to complete applications for scholarships and for post secondary admissions. With so many career opportunities available to you, it can be a daunting task to decide what type of postsecondary institute best suits your needs.

First of all, not one type of post-secondary institute is better than another. It is up to you to choose what sort of an institute provides the best academic and social fit for you. Whether you choose a university, college or technical institute, you can be assured that you will receive a quality education.

At a university, you will receive a broad based education deeply rooted in theory. After three to five years of successful university study, you may be eligible to receive a Bachelor's degree. With campus enrollments of up to 35,000 students and classroom sizes often exceeding 350 students, a university typically offers a less personable post-secondary learning environment. Although a university enrolls thousands of students each year, keep in mind that admission is academically competitive. If you are interested in pursuing a professional career in a field such as law, medicine, dentistry or if you wish to conduct graduate research, you will eventually attend a university. However, I would encourage you to consider starting your university studies at a college.

Most colleges allow you to finish your first one to two years of university study in a college setting. Smaller classroom sizes, lower tuition, less stringent entrance requirements, along with an increased accessibility to instructors and facilities create a personable learning environment. Colleges also offer career specific training, which allow you to earn a transferable academic credential after one to two years of successful study. Many programs, including apprenticeship training, combine academic study with practical experience.

Similar in many ways to a college, a **technical** institute provides hands-on training specific to industry. By offering one-year certificates, twoyear diplomas, applied degrees and apprenticeship training opportunities, most technical institute programs include a workexperience component. Tuition and entrance requirements vary tremendously not only from one technical institute to another, but also from one program to another.
